Given the outbreak of COVID19 we experienced before half term, we have taken the difficult decision not to hold an in-person Christmas Fair this this year. We know that this is disappointing, especially for our amazing PTFA who have been working hard behind the scenes making preparations. We can't run this event safely given the numbers who attend, the space available and being unable to rely on the weather in late November. Tuesday 7th December – Disco 3.15 – 4.45pm

Children can bring a maximum of £5 spending money in a named purse or wallet for drinks and snacks. Unfortunately, Reception parents will be unable to stay as is usually the case but there will be staff on hand to make sure that they are OK and we will have a trial run beforehand with the disco set up so they know what to expect.

Wednesday 8th & Thursday 9th December - Christmas Productions

Similar to the Christmas Fair, we have taken the difficult decision not to hold a traditional Ashchurch Christmas production this year. We are in 'bubbles' that do not mix for the first two weeks which leaves just 3.5 weeks to rehearse. Our shows involve the whole school and tickets always sell out. Packing 130 children and 120 parents into the hall just isn't feasible this year. Those of you who have attended our shows before will know just how 'cosy' they are!

We had considered putting on a show 'behind closed doors' and filming it for parents, but without the income from ticket sales, it would make a sizeable dent in the school budget. We also feel that the younger children wouldn't cope with spreading the performances out over more days to limit the size of the audiences.

Instead, our plan is to produce a 'Christmas wishes from Ashchurch' montage video of classes singing, dancing, acting and being festive which we will share towards the end of term.

Again, we know that this will be disappointing, but please be reassured the decision wasn't taken lightly and a range of options were considered.
