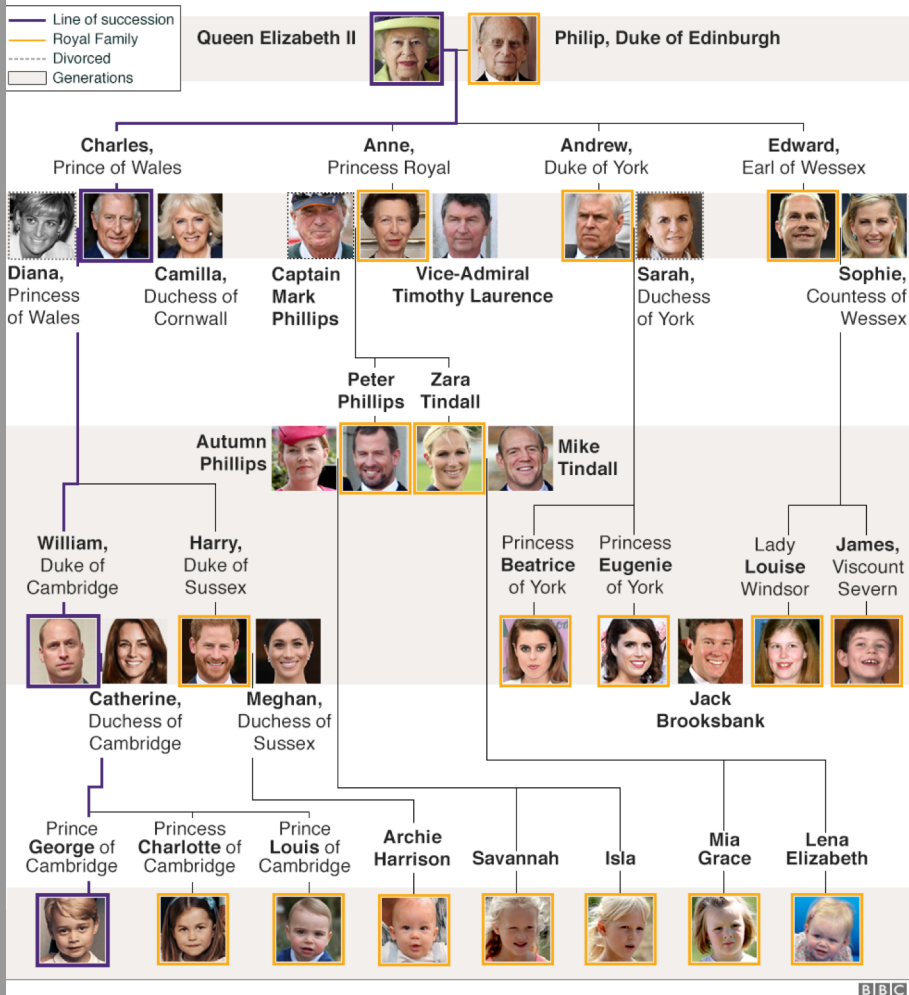

Here are some of the royal dress code rules

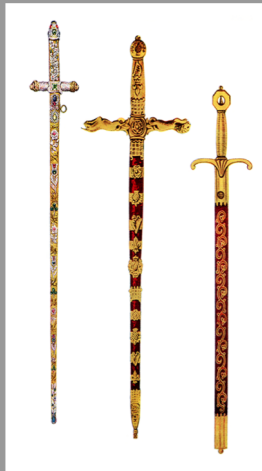
- Bright colours are necessary for the Queen

- 6 sceptres
- 3 robes

- 3 pieces of baptismal plate
- 3 prince of wales coronets
- 2 orbs
- 2 pairs of armills
- 1 pair of spurs
- 1 ampulla
- 1 spoon
- 1 walking stick
- 1 armlet
- 1 monde

There are 142 objects of the crown Jewels in the tower of london.
