LARGEST SEA CREATURE

The largest sea creature is a blue whale. A blue whale can weigh up to 3 tonnes and it averages around 25 feet in length.

Sadly, these harmless creatures are an endangered species. It is estimated that only around ten to twenty-five thousand whales remain in the seas. More than a thousand whales are killed every year for their meat and body parts which are sold for commercial gain. The death rate of whales can be decreased, only if people are willing to stop killing them for money and meat.

The blue whale only eats Krill, as they are not able to eat any other marine creatures due to their small throats.

MOST DANGEROUS SEA CREATURE

The most dangerous sea creature is a Box Jellyfish.

SMALLEST SEA CREATURE

They are a type of Heterotrophic plankton whose size ranges from microscopic organisms to large species, such as jellyfish.

Zooplankton are found within large bodies of water, including oceans and fresh water systems.
