The construction design of the Antilia building is completed in 2010. The construction of Antilia was finished by the B.E.Billimoria & Company Ltd. The height of the Antilia is 173m. Antilia is the most famous building in India and it is owned by the Indian Businessman Mukesh Ambani. Mukesh Ambani and his family members have never actually moved in full-time. There are 27 floors available in the Antilia Building.
